Sports Premium Funding Action Plan and Impact Statement, Sept. 2017.

Allocation for 2016/2017 was £9,975. It was spent on HLTA employment (£7K) to support PE development and extra curricular programme along with spending (£3K) on expanding our extra curricular programme. The amount for 2017/2018 is £10,021.

As a consequence of the following actions and their given impact, our school has been awarded with continued accreditation of 'The School Games Mark', first awarded in the Autumn Term 2016.

<u>Action</u>. Employment of HLTA to support teaching and learning in PE lessons and support provision of extra-curricular programme.

Impact.

- Enhanced quality, inclusive curriculum provision allowing less able, less confident pupils to engage better, succeed more and enjoy their activities.
- Improved pupil attainment and achievement. High percentage of pupils attaining 'Age Related Expectations'. High percentage of children making good or better than good progress from their starting points.
- Improved quality of teaching through team teaching between teachers and HLTA.

<u>Action.</u> Expanded provision of our extracurricular programme to include: Athletics, Basketball, Cross Country Running, Dance, Football, Girls Football, Gaelic Football, Netball, Rounders, Swimming, Tri-Golf and Core Fitness; the overwhelming majority at no cost to the children. 240 extracurricular sports club places on a weekly basis.

Impact.

- Increased participation in extracurricular activity. 240 extra curricular places offered across KS2 on a weekly basis after school which is a legacy of the most recent Olympic Games.
- Participation in Level 2 Inter School competitions to ten different sports: Athletics (indoor and outdoor competitions), Basketball, Cross Country Running, Football (Boys and Girls competitions), Gaelic Football, Netball (winners), Rounders, Swimming and Tri-Golf.
- Level 3 Regional competition qualifications in Athletics, Football, Gaelic Football, Netball, Rounders and Swimming with competitive results in most competitions eg West Midlands Schools 4-a-side football semi-finalists. Birmingham Catholic Schools Rounders winners. Birmingham Schools Rounders third place, Birmingham Catholic Schools Netball third place, Birmingham Schools rounders fifth place, Birmingham Catholic Schools Athletics top ten place.

Action. Maintain partnership with Archbishop Ilsley (ABI) Secondary School PE Department.

Impact.

- All 120 Y5/Y6 children access their PE curriculum using high quality facilities on the ABI school site. They are taught by secondary PE specialists with our staff in support. All the 120 Y5/Y6 children have the opportunity for one hour's extracurricular PE activity after school each week.
- A consequence of the above has been to create extra, sustainable capacity to our school site's PE space guaranteeing an afternoon of PE for each year group.
- Improved pupil attainment and achievement in core fitness and PE skills. High and increasing percentage of pupils attaining Age Related Expectations. High and increasing percentage of children making good or better than good progress from their starting points.
- Improved quality of teaching through ongoing CPD between ABI staff and our staff.

<u>Action.</u> All Y4, Y5 and Y6 children now take part in swimming.

Impact.

• Improved pupil attainment and achievement in swimming. Increasing percentage of pupils attaining Age Related Expectations. Increasing percentage of children making good or better than good progress from their starting points.

<u>Action.</u> Core fitness exercise programme established for 240 children across Y1, Y2, Y3 and Y4 children.

Impact.

• Positive attitudes to health and well being.
